



Why Not Prosper Highlights

General Highlights:

- We were able to purchase and pay in full the Rolling Engagement Van to give resources to the community.
- We've received several community awards:
 - Northwest Trailblazer Award from Steve Kinsey.
 - Community Service Award from Ruth Sisters International.
 - The 2023 Certificate of Excellence from the Malik Aziz Foundation.
 - The Social Innovator Racial Justice Advocator Award.
 - The Philadelphia Bar Association's Criminal Justice Advocacy Award.
 - The Humanitarian Award for Lockdown Love.

We served 1,200 women who received Love Bags at PICC.

SWAG Accomplishments:

- We attended over **404 city-wide events** and received citations from City Council and PA State Senator Art Haywood.
- We printed new materials, including: a deck of cards, calendar books, crossword puzzles and a journey into self book for women in PICC.

Fundraising Highlights:

29 Foundations and the Government: (\$1.436,381) 16 Businesses/Corporations (\$49,357) 95 Individuals (\$114,059) 140 Total Donors **\$1,599,797 Raised**

We received 3 unsolicited grants this year: Focus on Health Foundation, Barnes & Thornberg and an anonymous donor.

In 2023, we invested 77% of our income in Programs; 13% in Administration and 10% in Fundraising.





Program Updates:

- Workforce Academy
 - We launched 2 new initiatives in 2023: the flagger certificate and phlebotomy classes.
 - We continued offering certificates for home health aide, SafeServe, and job readiness, entrepreneurship, AB/GED tutoring services, and nursing aid assistance.
 - Every resident/participant receives a weekly bus pass and Identification card.
- We completed 2 years of Straight Outta Trouble, which was funded by the MacArthur grant.
- We completed 2 years of our antiviolence program and became the first female peace patrollers in Philadelphia.
